We are happy to announce that Johannes is the recipient of the "Gero Erdmann-Preis für vergleichende Area-Forschung". The prize is awarded by the Journal *Comparative Governance and Politics* and the working group *Democracy Research* of the German Association for Political Science (DVPW). It honors the best dissertation of the years 2013 and 2014. In his dissertation, Johannes analyzes the stabilizing conditions of East Asia's autocratic regimes. 10th Pan-European Conference in Turkey cancelled / EDP section to relocate to the Peace Research Institute Frankfurt

With deep sorrow we have followed recent events in Turkey. In light of the severe repression against academia, the EISA board has decided on July 21, 2016, to cancel its annual conference originally to be held in Izmir, Turkey, from 7-10 September. The decision at that point was inevitable and yet it is very regrettable. We are currently in the process of relocating our section entitled "Democracy Promotion as Interaction: Rethinking the External-Internal Interplay in International Relations" to the Peace Research Institute Frankfurt on 8-9 September 2016, and we will keep you updated on this process on our website.

We agree with EISA's public statement on the cancellation, and our thoughts are with our Turkish colleagues and with everyone currently suffering from the assault on academic freedom and other repressive measures.
