# In the Spotlight: Jonas Wolff



Jonas Wolff has been a member of the Network since 2005 and contributed significantly to the networks development throughout different project phases. He is an executive board member of the Peace Research Institute Frankfurt (PRIF), where he directs the research department on intrastate

conflict. In his research, Jonas is particularly interested in the conceptual politics of democracy and democracy promotion, but he also studies social movements, civic space restrictions, post-conflict violence and international foreign and development politics. His regional expertise is on Latin America. In April this year, Jonas also joined Goethe University Frankfurt as a professor of political science. He held his inauguration lecture recently.
